



### Important: Cart Access is Key

- » Place carts at least 3 feet away from other carts or objects
- » Give at least 14 feet clearance above cart from low branches
- » Make sure cart handle faces house
- » Place used motor oil in clear 1 gallon jugs and in view of drivers
- » Do not block sidewalk access

## Eagle Residential Trash and Recycling Guide

### Trash and Recycling Service Billing

## Trash Guidelines

- » Trash and recycling must be set out by 7am with the lids closed. Place carts 3ft. from other carts and objects (fire hydrants, mailboxes, cars, utility poles) with the handle towards the house. Make sure carts are in a safe and accessible location with 14' of overhead clearance. Do not block sidewalks. All containers must be removed from curbside within 24 hours.
- » All residents will receive a 95-gallon trash cart for automated pick-up (65 and 35-gallon available upon request). Residential trash fees are based on the size of the trash cart.
- » Use the right container: Customers with limited (35 or 65 gallon trash cart) service must contain all waste in the cart. Customers with "Unlimited" 95 gallon cart service must fill their cart first before placing additional trash in 32 gallon trash cans with lids or securely closed heavy duty trash bags (1.5 ml or greater), up to 10 bags per week. All customers may place more than 10 additional bags and/or cans per week for collection during Spring Clean Up, Fall Leaf Collection, or Holiday Clean Up week.
- » Bag trash to prevent blowing during service.
- » Additional carts are available for an extra monthly fee. Overflow stickers are also available for purchase by Limited Service customers.
- » Place used motor oil in clear 1 gallon jugs, make them visible to driver on trash day (up to 2 gallons per week).
- » No tires, liquids, hazardous waste, or vehicle batteries allowed in trash cart. See section on HHW for more information.
- » Eagle customers age 65 and older with 95-gallon cart service are eligible for a senior discount. Contact Republic Services to apply (208) 345-1265.

## Bulky Waste & Appliances

Republic Services provides appliance, furniture and other large item collection for an additional fee. Bulky items must be outside and visible to the driver on trash day. To arrange for a special pick-up call (208) 345-1265.

Unlimited trash service is available for all residents the week after Christmas and during Spring Clean-Up, which occurs the first full week of March. Free pick-up of bulky items and non-Freon appliances is available during Spring Clean-Up. You must call to schedule service.

## Hazardous Waste

All hazardous materials should be taken to the Hazardous Waste collection site located in the parking lot between Eagle Library and Eagle City Hall. This site is open quarterly from noon-7pm on the 2nd Wednesday of January, April, July, and October. The following materials will be accepted: fluorescent tubes, CFL bulbs, paint, stain, varnish, computer monitors, televisions, vehicle batteries, gasoline, oil, pesticides, and herbicides. ## Carry-Out Service

Customers who qualify under the American with Disabilities Act may receive free carry-out service. Other customers may sign up for carry-out service for an extra monthly charge. To order carry-out service call (208) 345-1265.

## Holiday Collection Schedule

Republic Services observes the following holidays: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day

During holiday weeks, if your normal collection day falls on or after the holiday, your collection will be delayed by one day. Holidays falling on the weekend will not delay collection.

## Yard Waste Preparation

Cut tree limbs, hedge trimmings, or other wood waste into sections less than 4 feet. Tie bundles 18 inches or less in diameter and set out in compact piles weighing 60 lbs. or less.

Contain grass clippings, leaves and other debris in your cart or trash can weighing 60 lbs. or less. Please no sod, dirt, or rocks.

## Recycling Guidelines

- » Recycling pick-up occurs on your trash day, every other week. For collection dates visit the calendar online at [local.republicservices.com/site/Idaho](http://local.republicservices.com/site/Idaho) Place recycle cart curbside by 7am.
- » All customers will receive a 95-gallon no sort recycling cart. Smaller 65 or 35-gallon carts available upon request.
- » All-in-One Recycling: recyclable items may be mixed in cart (see list on the right).
- » No glass, Styrofoam, or yard waste in recycling cart.
- » Leave recycling loose in cart or use paper bags to contain materials.
- » No plastic bags.
- » Flatten or cut down boxes to fit in cart. Lid must be able to close.

## Fall Leaf Recycling

Leaves will be collected the first four full weeks of November. Leaves will be ground and used as soil amendment. Leaves must be contained in large compostable paper leaf bags that will be collected on the same day as your trash.

A drop box for leaves (in paper bags or loose) will be available next to the glass recycling container at City Hall from mid-October until mid-December.

## Tree Recycling

Christmas trees are recycled the first full week after Christmas, and the first full week in January. Cut trees and branches into 4 ft. pieces and place curbside on your collection day. Trees must be stripped of all lights, ornaments, tinsel and stands. Flocked trees will not be recycled.

## Glass Recycling

A glass drop off site is located in the parking lot between Eagle City Hall and Eagle Library. It is free of charge. Please only place BOTTLES AND JARS in green glass container. NO mirrors, windows, Pyrex, dishes, tanks, lights, or ceramics. Cardboard, bags, lids, corks, and garbage are also NOT allowed at glass site.



## What can be recycled?

### PAPER AND CARDBOARD

Cardboard boxes (broken down to fit in cart)  
Frozen food & cereal boxes (no liners)  
Construction paper  
Envelopes (cellophane window ok)  
Office waste paper (any color)  
Magazines & catalogs  
Computer & fax paper  
Phone books  
Newspapers  
Paper bags  
Junk mail

### PLASTICS

Bottles and Jugs. Must be marked with #1 or #2 recycle symbol.  
No lightweight water bottles or clamshell containers  
No plastic bags or other soft plastics

### CANS

Aluminum, steel, tin, and aerosol cans (must be empty and labels are okay).

### HEFTY ORANGE ENERGY BAG

Plastics with #4-#7  
Plastic bags, caps, dairy tubs, flatware, packaging, lids, cups (no #1), chip and candy wrappers, pouches, straws, foam, shrink wrap, air packs, tubes, deodorant tubes. Tie bag and place in recycle cart. No paper. No water bottles. No clam shell containers.

Remember: Empty, Clean, and Dry before placing in recycle cart.

### DO NOT RECYCLE

Lightweight water bottles, soft or flimsy plastics, food waste, yard waste, glass, Styrofoam/packaging, chip and candy wrappers, hazardous waste containers, food contaminated paper (pizza boxes, plates, coffee cups), wax coated cardboard, milk and juice paper cartons, tissues, napkins, and paper towels.
