

Over the past few years, your Eagle Public Library introduced a number of digital services that bring the library to you. E-books and e-audiobooks, e-graphic novels, digital magazines, streaming movies, streaming and downloadable music – all bring library resources directly to you.

There's yet another way that the Library comes to you. Through the HouseCalls program, library resources are delivered to homebound City of Eagle residents. The service is available to City of Eagle residents who are unable to use the library because they are generally confined to their residence either temporarily, due to illness or accident, or permanently due to age, disability or other mobility issues. Participants in the program may reside in private homes, retirement residences, or assisted living facilities. Care givers to a person requiring continuous care are also eligible. All you need is to reside in the City of Eagle and have an Eagle Public Library account. If you don't have a library account, it's easy to get one. To enroll in the service, call the Library at 939-6814 or complete the application at eaglepubliclibrary.org.

Thanks to the generosity of the Friends of the Eagle Public Library, the Library has a collection of Alzheimer's and dementia therapy resources that include puzzles, games, and manipulatives available to be checked out. Look for this new collection near the large print books. And please remember to support the Friends of the Eagle Public Library through their book sales; the Friends provide valuable support to the Library for children's summer reading programs, audiobooks, and special collections.
